Draft Scoring Guidance for the Fiscal Year 2022 Arlington County Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for County Loan Funds

County staff, in its sole discretion, may recommend any combination of Affordable Housing Investment Fund (AHIF), Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), or HOME Investment Partnership (HOME) sources (or other sources not specifically mentioned herein) for funding. Only applications that propose can feasible use of Federal HOME and/or CDBG funds, as determined by staff to be feasible according to timing and other requirements as noted in the application, will be eligible for funding through this NOFA process. Please note that if a project is recommended for funding utilizing county HOME funds, the county may require the applicant to adhere to Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO) eligibility requirements and become certified as a CHDO to be able to accept HOME CHDO funds. The use of Federal CDBG and HOME funds require adherence to Federal compliance and only certain projects are eligible and/or feasible. Only projects that are eligible for use of Federal funds, as determined by staff, will be able to utilize any additional local loan funds that may be available.
